Last year, Ridgewood 3-2-1 had 107 members, many of whom were not ACTIVE and the Board decided it was better to make the necessary adjustments and downsize. Even with the loss of 47 members, Ridgewood 321 is the second largest club in the Division and the 6th largest club in NY District. Since the beginning of the year, we have added 8 new members and are currently at 68 dues paying members. It is anticipated that we could install another 8 members at our March 16th meeting to put us at 76 members. Understand that every member costs the club \$100 to Kiwanis International which led to the drop of all those members. In Janine's year we paid \$11,000 in dues and lost some Corporate, Business and Individual members due to COVID. You will also notice that many clubs have multiple names. The reason for that is that over the years, clubs have had to merge together in order to stay open and alive. Today, the Queens West Division has just about 500 members and that is a loss of 83 from last year's membership. If that trend continues, by 2030, Kiwanis would be gone in Queens West. How sad that service is taking such a hit in Kiwanis and around the world. As a member for almost 40 years, that is beyond sad.
