March 6th – Next Meeting of Ridgewood 3-2-1 at Clubhouse @ 12 noon. Kiddy Kidz will perform for Club.

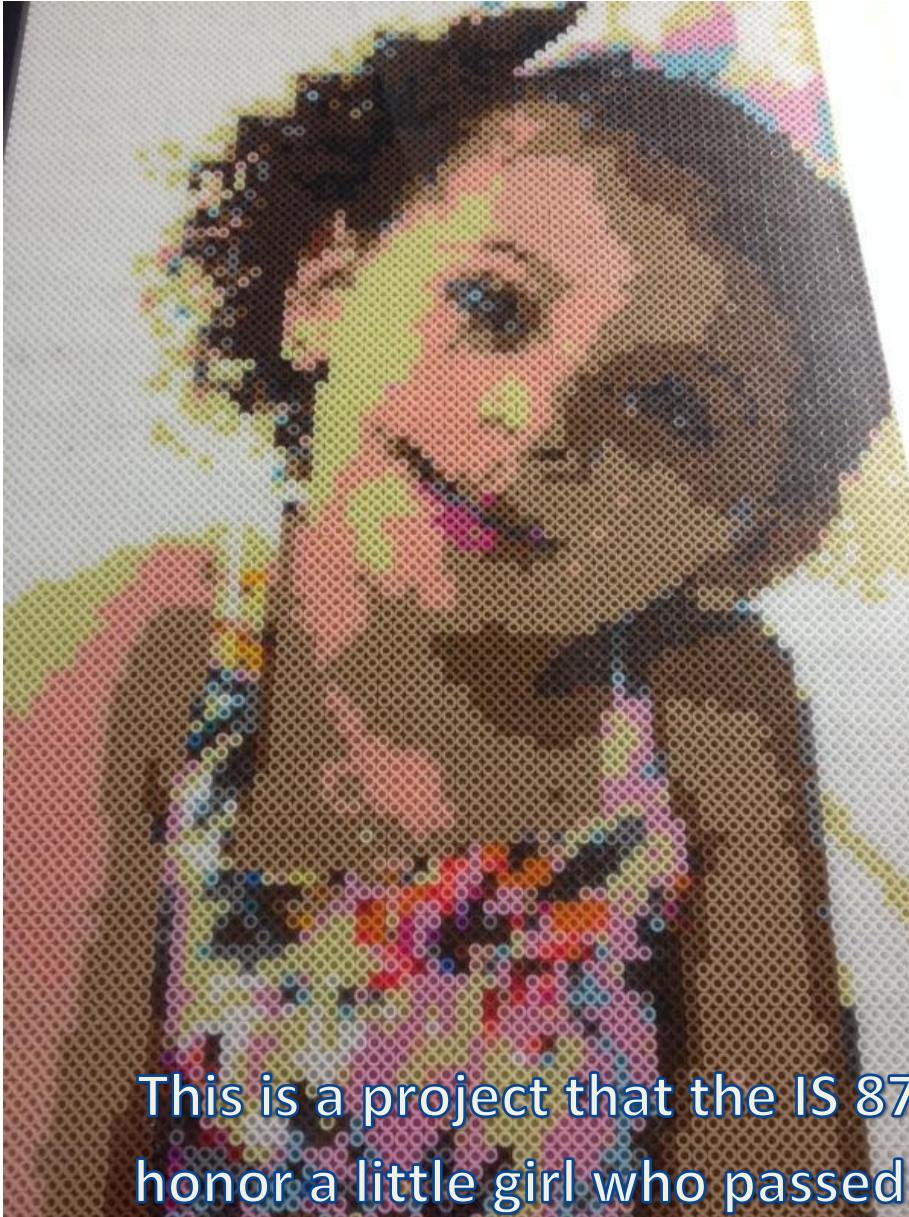
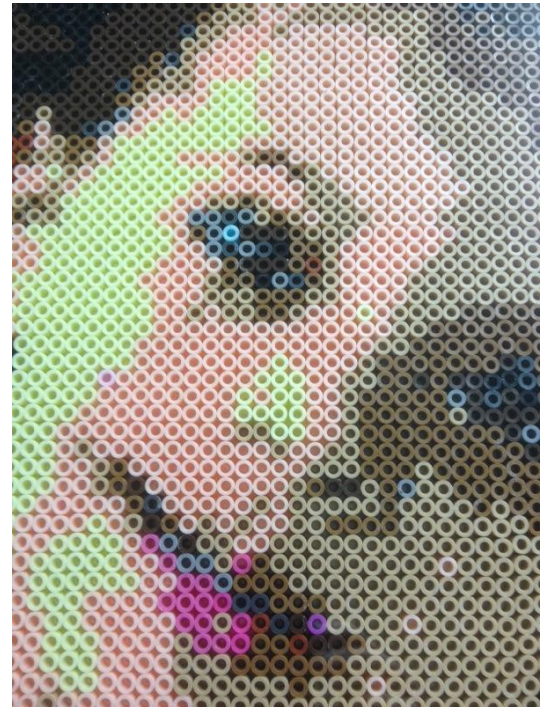
