RESULTS Of MEET For: April 17, 2019

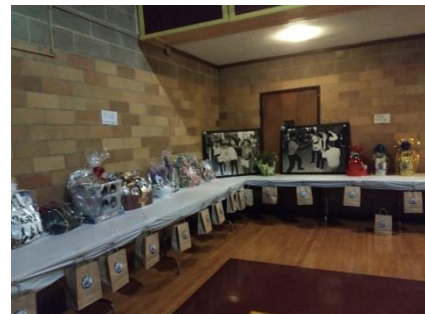

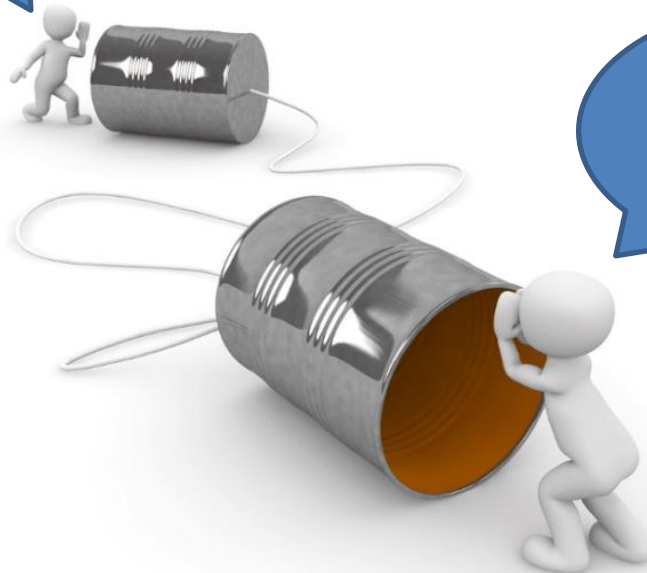
